



OUR HOME Hanapepe, Kaua'i


E Komo Mai! Welcome! Hanapepe, meaning crushed bay in Hawaiian, sits between a fertile farming valley and the sparkling blue waters of Salt Pond Beach on Kauai's southwestern shore. Our town is the **gateway to the West side of Kaua`i**, home to Grand Waimea Canyon and the misty forests of Koke`e State Park.

Hanapepe is beloved by residents and visitors alike for its loyalty to *architectural* preservation, support of cultural and artistic perpetuation, and simply because it exemplifies Hawaiian ho`okipa, the hospitality of aloha.



CHALLENGES

Unemployment and poverty in our community is higher than the State average, with a median household income of \$44,112.



West Kaua'i ranks:

- Third highest in the State to exposure and use of illicit drugs
- With more than 50% of teens lacking after-school parental supervision
- And less than 14% of parents having earned a college degree

More than half of all households are raising kids under 18 years old, yet our community struggles to provide safe and enriching early education programming and after-school activities.




ASSETS



Kauai's West Side is home to nearly 11,000 residents. Our multi-ethnic community celebrates racial, ethnic, and religious diversity.

86% are of Asian and Native Hawaiian ancestry, with less than 14% of Caucasian heritage.

We measure third-highest in the State for "neighborhood stability". This can be credited to the continuity of family and high levels of homeownership.
